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# NON STRESS TEST + ULTRASOUND







The fifth factor in a biophysical profile is the heart rate response to activity, which is measured by a nonstress test.

#### NON STRESS TEST

- 20-30 minutes
- Doppler
  ultrasound measures heart
  rate by
  observing
  blood flow
- Two bands are strapped around the mother's stomach






### FETAL ULTRASOUND

- Tracks fetal movement
- Tracks fetal breathing
- Identifies fetal muscle tone
- Measures amniotic fluid



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#### SCORING

- How do you score a BPP?
  - There are 5 parameters which are assessed
  - Scores are given 0-2
  - o A total score is out 10
- What does the score indicate?
  - A score <4 may indicate that the health of the fetus is at risk</li>
  - o Baby may be delivered or other tests may be done

## WHY MIGHT A PERSON GET A BPP?

- A doctor may recommend a BPP if...
  - High-risk pregnancy
  - Overdue
  - Diabetes
  - Hypertension
  - Multiple pregnancy
